- 3. Must not have a physical profile capacity of P3 or higher IAW AR 40-501
- 4. Must meeet eligibility requirements outlined in Chapter 2, NGR 600-5 and AR 135-18, and must meet all OSHA physical requirements prior to assignment.
- 5. Must be able to don and perform physical tasks in PPE (personal protective equipment) including SCBA (self contained breathing apparatus)
- 6. Must reside within 50 miles of duty location.
- 7. Must currently hold a Secret Security Clearance.
- 8. Must have a passing ACFT with DA 705 within the past 6 months.
- 9. Must not be currently flagged for favorable actions

BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION:

Serves as the medical provider for Civil Support Team operations; providing medical support of CST training exercises and real-world response activities involving simulated or realworld hazards; serves as the Medical and Analytical Section Leader, coordinating and managing medical / analytical resources for disaster preparation nationwide. Responsible for planning and tracking all medical readiness requirements for unit members IAW NGR 500-3 and AR 40-501, provides medical examinations of Civil Support Team members in all phases of employment, including pre-employment, annual and termination of Civil Support Team membership. Makes formal recommendations to command authorities regarding medical fitness qualifications for participation in hazardous duty assignment. The selectee will manage all aspects of the unit occupational health program, including vaccination, respiratory protection, and risk factor profiling for preventing occupational injury of assigned personnel. The selectee will serve as the senior medical provider and will administer standard of care treatment IAW established ACLS, ATLS and ABLS guidelines. The selectee will be expected to demonstrate strong clinical decision-making abilities, including the management of traumatic injuries and illness resulting from exposure to chemical, biological and ionizing radiation hazards. The CST Physician Assistant will supervise and manage for analytical operations and will participate in activities relating to laboratory certification IAW ISO 17025. A desire and aptitude for complex scientific concepts; including an ability to recognize the symptoms of exposure to toxic industrial chemicals, chemical warfare agents, biological or radiological hazardous incidents is required for assignment. Selectee will be required to understand how hazards affect a local populace, including transmission, persistency, decontamination methods and medical treatment protocols of specific hazards and will make recommendations to Command. State and Federal agencies.

The selectee will be required to maintain all professional certifications, including licensure in the State of Mississippi, NCCPA certification and active DEA registration authority. Reports to the unit on short notice when not on leave or pass, for immediate emergency response to suspected WMD incidents. Functions in a non-traditional, all AGR, full-time National Guard unit. Coordinates with the MSARNG State Surgeon.
