If ASVAB scores reflected on your ERB are not current you must submit your latest ASVAB scoresheet with your application. Any applicants that do not include the new scores and do not meet the minimum score requirements will be disqualified.

BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION:

Airplane pilot and Aviation Safety Officer for Detachment 18 OSA, which normally consists of one C-12U/V fixed wing aircraft and nine unit members. The Detachment provides passenger and cargo transportation services in both CONUS and OCONUS. Mission profiles include all aspects of both the National Airspace System and ICAO Airspace System. Duties include advice and assistance to leadership at all levels regarding aviation and ground operations, and implementation of the Commander's Safety Program. Serves as subject matter expert for integrating risk management on and off duty, and ensuring safe aviation operations. Flight duties include CONUS and OCONUS flight planning and mission execution in all meteorological conditions IAW applicable regulations. While deployed as well as home station, establish and maintain an appropriate safety culture that enables crew members to operate continuously and autonomously across all geographic boundaries. Additional duties include, but are not limited to Unit Operations Officer and Unit Contracting Officer Representative.
