
Derek had two favorite scriptures that He lived by:

Joshua 1:9 "This is my command—be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid or discouraged. For the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."



Chief Warrant Officer 4 Derek Joshua Abbott began his military career on Dec. 27, 2002, when he enlisted in Tupelo, Mississippi, as a private in Company D, 1st Battalion, 159th Aviation Regiment, Mississippi Army National Guard. Promoted to private second class the following month and transferring to Troop E, 1st Squadron, 104th Cavalry Regiment, Abbott went on to Advanced Individual Training, becoming a 15R – AH-64 Attack Helicopter Repairer upon graduation in October 2003. He quickly rose through the ranks, promoting to private first class in November 2003, specialist in January 2004, and after spending some time in Troop D, 1-104th, he transferred back to Troop E and promoted to sergeant in July 2004.

While serving in Troop E, 1-104th, Abbott attended Warrant Officer Candidate School, graduating on April 29, 2005, and pinning the rank of warrant officer one. Abbott's first assignment as a warrant officer was with Troop E as an AH-64A Apache Pilot. He deployed to Iraq in August 2006, continuing to serve as an Apache pilot. It was during this deployment when Abbott earned the Air Medal with Valor for his actions on April 7, 2007. The award narrative reads, in part:

"For exceptionally valorous achievement during air operations supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom on 7 April 2007 at Diwaniyah, Iraq. WO1 Abbott's willingness to place himself in harms way to protect his fellow Soldiers was beyond the call of duty. He continued to provide protection to the lead aircraft despite having received battle damage to his aircraft."

Abbott's other assignments included Aircraft Armament Maintenance Officer and Aviation Maintenance Officer with Company C, 1st Battalion, 151st Aviation Regiment; Aviation Maintenance Officer with Company A, 1st Battalion, 149th Aviation Regiment; Maintenance Test Flight Evaluator with Detachment 1, Company B, 834th Aviation Support Battalion; Aviation Maintenance Officer and Aircraft Armament Maintenance Officer with Company A, 1st Battalion, 149th Aviation Regiment; Aviation Maintenance Officer with Company A, 1108th Theatre Aviation Sustainment Maintenance Group in Gulfport; and Aviation Safety Officer for Company D of the 2d Battalion, 151st Lakota Medical Evacuation unit in Tupelo. He most recently served as a Maintenance Test Pilot with 2d Battalion, 151st Aviation Regiment – Lakota Medical Evacuation.
