



MISSISSIPPI NATIONAL GUARD COMMAND SERGEANT MAJOR BRIAN K. BELUE LAND FORCES COMPONENT, MISSISSIPPI

Command Sgt. Maj. Brian K. Belue is a 1988 graduate of Burnsville High School and holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business from Union University in Jackson, Tennessee. Belue enlisted in the Mississippi Army National Guard June 26, 1988, and is a 2009 graduate of the United States Army Sergeants Major Academy in Fort Bliss, Texas. He deployed in support of Operation Desert Storm in 1991, to the Al Anbar Province of Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in 2004, and in 2010 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, Tikrit, Iraq.

Belue attended Basic Training and Advance Individual Training at Fort Knox, Kentucky, where he received his primary MOS as a 19-K M1 Armor Crewman. He served as a tank commander from 1993-2001 and was promoted to sergeant first class as a Platoon Sergeant with Charlie Company, 1st Battalion, 198th Armor Regiment in 2004. Belue was appointed as the Battalion Command Sergeant Major for 1st Battalion, 155th Infantry Regiment, June 16, 2011. He was then appointed as the 1st Squadron, 98th Cavalry Regiment Command Sergeant Major in 2013.

Belue has served as the G3 Operations Sergeant Major and with the Camp Shelby Joint Forces Training Center's Department of Plans, Training, Mobilization and Security. He was selected as the Command Sergeant Major for the 155th Armored Brigade Combat Team in 2022 and deployed to Grafenwoehr, Germany in support of Joint Multinational Training Group Ukraine (JMTG-U) in November 2023. Belue was selected to serve in his current position as the Land Forces Component Command Sergeant Major in May 2025.

Belue's military education includes the Primary Leadership Development Course, Basic Noncommissioned Officer Course, Phases I-III of the Advanced Noncommissioned Officers Course, Active-Duty Component First Sergeants Course, and graduated with Class 34 of the U.S. Army Sergeants Major Academy.

His military awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with one bronze oak leaf, Army Commendation Medal with two bronze oak leaves, Army Achievement Medal with three bronze oak leaves, Army Good Conduct Medal, Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal with two silver oak leaves, National Defense Service Medal with one service star, Iraq Campaign Medal with one campaign star, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Medal with gold hour glass, M device, and numeral 2, NCO Professional Development Ribbon with numeral 5, the Combat Action Badge, and numerous other federal and state awards and decorations.
