## LIEUTENANT COLONEL BEN L. FOLAND

LTC Foland enlisted in the Mississippi Army National Guard in September 2002 and was commissioned after graduating from Officer Candidate School in March 2004. He completed U.S. Army Flight School in June 2005, earning his wings as a UH-60 Black Hawk pilot. Early in his career, he served as a Battle Captain during the Hurricane Katrina response and as a Platoon Leader with D Company, 1-185th Aviation Battalion from 2005 to 2007.
