After his enlisted time with the 114th Military Police Company, he commissioned through the state Officer Candidate School (OCS) program in 1999. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Jackson State University and an MBA in Project Management from Grantham University.

His military education includes the Chemical Officer Basic Course, Quartermaster and Ordnance Officer Branch Course, Combined Logistics Captains Career Course, Intermediate Level Education, Advanced Operations Course, Command and General Staff College, Defense Support of Civil Authorities Course, Army Mission Command Digital Master Gunner Course, Joint Logistics Course and the Reserve Component Theater Sustainment Course.



His mobilizations and special missions include Deputy S4, 168 EN Group deployment during OIF 1 from 2003 to 2004; MOB Officer and MRB Deputy OIC for the 184 ESC deployment to Kandahar, Afghanistan from 2009 to 2011; Mission Planner for the 184 ESC Saber Strike Mission in Poland in 2018; Mobility Branch Chief for 1 TSC Operational Command Post (OCP) from 2018 to 2019 and OIC for the 298 CSSB Jackson Water Crisis mission in 2022.

Hodge's awards include the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (3), Army Commendation Medal (3), Army Achievement Medal (2 OLC), Army Good Conduct Medal, Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal (6), National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal w/Campaign Star and many other state and federal awards.

He currently serves as the Support Operations Officer (SPO) at the 184 ESC and is the Supervisory Human Resources Specialist for the Department of the Navy.

Hodge and his wife, Kajanuary, currently reside in Perkinston, MS with their 2 children, Kajarian and Kamori and grandchild Kahlani.

Captain Terrence J. Lynch is a native of Hattiesburg, MS. He began his military career in February 2006 when he enlisted in the United States Army Reserve. He served in the 344 Maintenance Company (Bogalusa, LA) and the 7223 Medical Support Unit (Mobile, AL). In 2014, he transitioned to the Mississippi Army National Guard. He was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant through the University of Southern Mississippi's Reserve Officer Training Corps on 7 May 2015. He holds both a Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice and a Master of Science in Logistics, Trade, and Transportation from the University of Southern Mississippi.

Captain Lynch's military education includes the Ordnance Basic Officer Leaders Course, Human Resource Management Course, Support Operations Course, Joint Logistics Course, Contracting Officer Representative Course, and the Logistics Captain Career Course.

Lynch's previous assignments include Shop Office Platoon Leader, Executive Officer, and Maintenance Officer with Company B, 106th Brigade Support Battalion; Supply Management Officer, HHC, 106th BSB; Commander, Company F, 106th BSB; Project Officer with the 155th Armored Brigade Combat Team; and both Logistics and Operations Officer roles with the 298th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion. He deployed to Kuwait in 2018–2019 as a Platoon Leader and Maintenance Control Officer, where he also served as a Contracting Officer Representative. He currently serves as the G3 Training Officer for the 184th Expeditionary Sustainment Command in Monticello, Mississippi.
